#### ABOUT THE OCEAN ARTS FESTIVAL

SpectorDance and the Monterey Museum of Art are thrilled to present our 4<sup>th</sup> annual *Ocean Arts Festival* at the Monterey Museum of Art on Saturday, May 11, 2024 from 1-4 pm. This event features ocean-themed visual and performing arts created by young artists. The festival aims to harness the power of creativity to promote a deeper understanding of ocean science and inspire commitments to ocean stewardship.

The first Ocean Arts Festival took place in 2019 t the SpectorDance Studio in Marina. The concept was borne from SpectorDance's Ocean Trilogy, a performance on a 10-year collaboration with the Monterey Bay Aquarium Research Institute. SpectorDance's vision was for the *Ocean Arts Festival* to be an annual event that would grow and attract both young and professional artists in all genres from around the globe. With Covid-19, we were not able to present the *Ocean Arts Festival* in 2020 or 2021.

Since 2022, we have partnered with the Monterey Museum of Art to offer our 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and our upcoming 4<sup>th</sup> annual *Ocean Arts Festival*.

Spector Atkins states, "The Ocean Arts Festival is an annual celebration of the power of the arts to teach, inspire, and generate positive change in the world. Through multiple entry points, the festival fosters thought, conversation, and action, and stimulates participants to connect with artistic expression with their social and environmental impact."

She explains, "The Ocean Arts Festival exemplifies SpectorDance's mission, 'Creating & Presenting dance that makes a difference' and vision, 'a world where everyone is connected, informed, & inspired through the beauty & power of dance."

#### **VIDEO KEYNOTE REMARKS**

**DR. JOHN HOLDREN** was President Obama's chief Science Advisor and Director of the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy from 2009 to 2017. Dr. Holdren is currently a research professor at Harvard University, and was formerly the Director of the Woods Hole Research Center and the Teresa and John Heinz Professor of Environmental Policy at Harvard. Among his numerous honors are the MacArthur Genius Prize (1981) and most recently the National Academy of Sciences Public Welfare Medal (2022).

**JULIE PACKARD** is the executive director of the Monterey Bay Aquarium, which she helped found in the late 1970's. She is an international leader in the field of ocean science conservation, and a leading voice for science-based policy reform in support of a healthy ocean.
